No Funeral Pants in Heaven

It was before the pandemic when I bought the pants. We'd had a series of deaths in our small congregation. I didn't own anything really formal enough for a funeral, and I found myself standing at a rack of black slacks at the local JC Penney. I grabbed a pair, tried them on, and then wore them to three funerals in less than a month. They became my funeral pants.



I put them on again last fall for two funerals of church members who'd died of covid. I put them on again this spring when a church member lost her brother to a long illness.

Today, I reached to the back of my closet and pulled out my funeral pants. Paired them with a some heels that have seen better days and a flowy top. Grabbed a sweater since the weather has turned cool. Prayed for my husband as he prepared to preach the funeral for one of his closest friend's twin daughters, born prematurely this week. Two nights in a row this week, the phone has rung with calls from church members, both of whom lost adult children suddenly to death.

"How long, O Lord?" I have prayed. In the night while fighting with my own

body and the pain that seems to rule. After phone calls that break your heart for the suffering of others. In my journal where everything pours out in a messy lament.

What are we really praying for when we cry out "How long?"

Are we praying to an end of our present sufferings? Yes. Are we praying for life circumstances to change? Yes. Are we praying for physical or emotional or relational healing? Yes. Are we praying for everything that's wrong to be made right? Yes.


So really, when we're praying "How long, O Lord? we're praying, "Come quickly, Lord."

Because it's the return of Christ that will set everything to right. It's the return of Christ that will raise the dead in Him in glorious resurrection. It's the return of Christ that will finally defeat our last and final enemy—death.

Where Will We Spend the Holidays This Year?

I loved my Memere; she taught me so much about hospitality!

The question, "Whose house do we go to this Christmas?" often creates tension and conflict. Early in our marriage my Memere (my mother-in-law) offered an answer that relieved the pressure of this question and created a treasured tradition that continues to this day. As her children married and



started families she acknowledged her "in-law" children also had families and traditions. Rather than pressure them to eat dinner at her house on Thanksgiving Day, Memere. started the Sunday after Thanksgiving Italian dinner. All of

her children, the in-laws, and grandchildren looked forward to gathering for

this festive dinner with her homemade pasta noodles, sauce, braciola, wedding soup, antipasti, and more... even if some were able to join her for a turkey dinner a few days before. After she passed away my husband and I continued in her footsteps and the Sunday after Thanksgiving we invite the family to our home for all the homemade Italian delights she served.

Her heart of kindness helped me, a mother of a large, growing family, to reduce some of the emotional and physical stress holidays can bring. Years ago we started to offer alternate "days" not just for Thanksgiving, but also for Christmas and Easter. My adult children have other obligations now – young children's needs and another family to consider. Giving them this option relieves some of the pressure of the holidays. So even if the calendar "days" may not be the day we celebrate together, I smile because I know the Sunday after... is coming!

One recipe that is very special not only to this meal, but one I have shared at different events is her antipasti. It's great for breakfast or brunch and it just looks special to serve.

Memere's Antipasti

Navel oranges peeled and sliced into ½ slices (6/8 slices per orange)

Hard boiled eggs -1 hard boiled egg is about 5/6 slices (Memere would said, add 1 TLBS vinegar to the boiling water so the egg yokes would be pretty yellow. IDK J)

Sliced from the deli counter: Ham or Sliced pepperoni American or Provolone Cheese Salt, Pepper, Paprika

On a platter, places a single layer of orange slices. Top with a trimmed slice of Ham or Pepperoni Top with a trimmed slice of American or Provolone

Top with a slice of hard-boiled egg

I make two separate platters one with ham/American cheese that the young kids like better and one with Pepperoni and Provolone cheese for the adults.



You can cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate until you are ready to serve.

When you are ready to serve to your guests, uncover the plastic wrap, season with a little salt, pepper and paprika and serve.




